

It's Scholarship Time

Huron United Methodist Church Scholarships are available this Spring for the 2025-2025 school year.

The criteria for the HUMC Scholarship are: 1) Huron UM Church attendance; 2) enrollment in any college; and 3) good academic Scholarships record. In addition, an essay is

required which is described on the application.

Applications are being sent out to all HUMC high school seniors during the first week of

March. Other applicants may pick up their copies in the Welcome Center or contact the Church Office to have one sent to them via mail or email.

Scholarships are contingent on funds available and may be split depending on the number of qualified applicants and the discretion of the Scholarship Committee. In the past, the HUMC Scholarship has been \$500 or \$1000.

Please note that the application deadline is Sunday, April 28, 2024.



If you would like to see this beautiful artwork in person, it will be finding a place to be hung in one of the classroom hallways soon.



UMCOR Sunday is March 10, 2024

What is UMCOR Sunday?

This Special Sunday is a denomination wide celebration designed to raise awareness and support for the ministry of The United Methodist Committee on Relief – otherwise known as



UMCOR. The UMCOR Sunday offering underwrites UMCOR's administrative costs to ensure 100% of gifts given for humanitarian response and recovery go directly to communities in need. These gifts ensure UMCOR can respond swiftly to disasters around the world and represent hope and healing to those most vulnerable. Gifts can be made online, or by check to local churches.

UMCOR, provides hope for communities and individuals whose lives have been upset by war, storms or other crises. This ministry is achieved exclusively through your generosity. Last year, your generosity delivered \$1.7

million towards these ministries:

- ▶ International Disaster Response efforts provide assistance following natural or human-caused disasters outside of the United States. Typical emergency response efforts include the distribution of food, hygiene supplies and facilities, nonfood items, psychosocial support and shelter.
- ▶ U.S. Disaster Response works with annual conferences in the United States to alleviate suffering caused by disasters that strike within the United States and its territories. In partnership with conference level disaster response coordinators, UMCOR journeys with affected communities

throughout a disaster's cycle.

► Global Migration provides relief and recovery in the form of food aid, b

and recovery in the form of food aid, basic necessities, and legal and transportation services for vulnerable migrants and refugees.

▶ Relief Supplies UMCOR Sager Brown Depot and affiliate warehouses within the UM Relief Supply Network collect relief supplies that are assembled by United Methodist volunteers for distribution in the United States and its territories in response to disasters.

UMCOR's goal is to assist vulnerable people affected by crisis or chronic need without regard to their nationality, race, religion or status. We believe all people have God-given worth and dignity.

One of the wonderful aspects of the connectional nature of The United Methodist Church is that we can do so much more together than we ever could do on our own. Because of you – UMCOR and its partners serve as witnesses to God's love for all.

Africa University Dedicates Residence Hall

The official dedication of the Bishop Tracy S. Malone Hall of Residence for female students took place on Monday, February 26th at Africa University. Bishop Malone and a team from East Ohio were on campus and other clergy and laity participated in the dedication via live stream. See the EOC Facebook page.

The Bishop Tracy S. Malone Hall of Residence offers modern amenities and a nurturing environment conducive to academic success for the 90 female students who now call the dorm home.

"Being among the first residents of this hostel has been amazing," said Rumbidzo Sande, a firstyear law



student. "The smiles on my block mates' faces as they enjoy the comfort and luxury of our rooms create a serene environment for all of us."

Increasing enrollment and demand for on-campus housing meant that students would commute daily from off-campus housing putting them at considerable risk for living in and being subjected to untenable situations.

Malone cast her vision for the residence hall during her 2019 Episcopal Address to Annual Conference. Laity and clergy embraced the vision and supported the Teach * Reach * Bless campaign, raising and collecting more than \$1.5 million in only two years despite the campaign launching two months before the pandemic.

Thank you to all who supported this endeavor through your pledges and outright donations. HUMC raised the funds for an entire room!

Compass Point Senior Enrichment Center

The Erie County Health
Department and the Erie County
Community Health Center (ECHD /
ECCHC) are pleased to offer adult
day services at our new facility,
Compass Point Senior Enrichment
Center. The facility will be certified
by the Ohio Department of Aging and
will provide supervision and
assistance throughout the day with
professional caring staff.

The location is the previous Lutheran Memorial Nursing Home located at 795 Bardshar Road in Sandusky. ECHD / ECCHC will provide a safe, interactive, and healthy environment for loved ones to meet new friends, create new lifelong relationships, and participate in structured activities that stimulate the mind and body. At the same time, giving caretakers a needed respite to continue providing the love and care that keeps their family members at home surrounded by loved ones.

As we continue our implementation, we will work with transportation providers and the Ohio Department of Medicaid, as well as private insurance providers, state, and local funding sources, to connect clients to benefits to utilize the program.

Hours will be Monday through Friday 9:00 a.m. to 2:30 p.m. We will follow ECHD / ECCHC's federal holiday schedule and have a calendar on this website alerting clients and their caretakers to those dates.
