I have been listening in on the happenings at our 2020 General

Conference which is meeting in Charlotte, NC, now. (Yes, it really is the 2020 General Conference – delayed – and not the 2024 General Conference because

there is nothing in our UM polity that allows us to cancel a General Conference.) Bishop Holston, while addressing the Conference, said some notable things that inspired me to pay closer attention

and to think about where we – Huron UMC – have been, where we are, and where we are headed...

Bishop Holston said we need to focus on, "Who we are. Who we say we are. Who we want to be." He asked, "How do we become who God needs us to be?" And he insisted that, "If you know your 'why' your 'what' will make a difference."

Thinking about those things in the context of all we have been through over the course of the last few years, I began to think about how we need to move away from "survival mode" and toward "How do we become who God needs us to be mode." We need to be willing to adapt in an ever-changing world (whether we like it or not). We need to look forward. We need to focus on the future. We need to move ahead.

Imagine a rearview mirror... What happens if, while driving along, one spends too much time looking into it – focusing on what has passed rather than what lies ahead? If we are to "become who God needs us to be," I would suggest that we must spend more time looking through the windshield than through the rearview mirror; more time looking to the future than to the past; more time looking ahead than looking back. I believe that we – the church – must continue to look forward, focus on the future, and move ahead!

Imagine what it will be like when we are the church God needs us to be!

We are Huron United Methodist Church! WooHoo! We

are disciples of Jesus, the Christ, followers of the living God, and sharers of the WORD! May God continue to encourage, empower, and equip us as we strive "to make [and mature] disciples of Jesus Christ for the transformation of the world!" WELCOME – WORSHIP – WITNESS!

LIFT (Living In Faith Together) continues to grow our fellowship! This multigenerational night of fun

has classes, conversation, food, puzzles, foosball and games. Doors open at 4:45 p.m. All are invited! All are welcome! All means ALL! This is a perfect time to grow your faith, get reacquainted with old friends as well as meet new ones. At 6:30 p.m. we gather together in the Fellowship Hall for dinner, and at 7:00 p.m. there is Chancel Choir rehearsal and continued fellowship. Come for any or all of the evening!

The Adult LIFT Class is viewing season 2 of *The Chosen* series. Each Wednesday we watch a portion of a show and then leave room for discussion. The participants have really appreciated how this series has brought them a deeper understanding of the Bible stories we have all heard.



The Children's Class has moved onto a video series called "The Story Keepers." This animated series tells the story of a family who are being persecuted because of their faith in Jesus. It is centered around a baker, his wife and children set in the Roman times and the beginning foundations of the Christian faith.

Our Youth Fellowship has been learning about Christian symbols, their meanings and history. They also had a discussion on being good stewards of our earth. This was in conjunction with the Festival of God's Creation/Earth Day/ Arbor Day. They are enjoying their new TV that was recently installed in the Youth Room. LIFT Lite will start this month!

Huron UMC was awarded \$1500 to be used to start our LIFT Lite ministry! WOO HOO!!! The funding is on behalf of Rev. Ed Fashbaugh, the Director of Connectional Ministries, from the DCM Creative Ministry Fund.

LIFT Lite will bridge the gap over the summer months when LIFT is usually on hiatus. This will be a less formal gathering where we do not break into smaller groups. We talked with our current LIFT participants to get their opinions on what they would like to see over the summer. The overall consensus was games and they didn't want any consecutive lessons, in case they miss a week or two for vacations.

Our plan for LIFT Lite is to create a variety of fun filled evenings: game show night, ga-ga ball night, puzzle night, and movie night.

Game Show Night consists of games that can be displayed on a large screen. We will create games, such as "HUMC Jeopardy", "HUMC Family Feud", and "Are You Smarter Than Pastor P?". We will divide into teams and use buzzers to compete in the games.

Ga-ga ball is a game that is quickly becoming a favorite with our area children. Ga-ga ball is a form of dodgeball but balls are hit or rolled on the ground to eliminate a player. It requires little athletic skill, but is fun for all ages, fitting perfectly into our multigenerational night of fellowship.

We feel very passionately that this LIFT Lite program will strengthen the relationships with the people who currently attend LIFT, encourage members of our church who haven't been to LIFT to join in the fun happening during LIFT Lite, inspire attendees to invite their friends, and welcome members of the community to see what HUMC has to offer. This new ministry is set to begin on May 29, 2024.

Ice Cream Social Is Becoming An Annual Event






