
Lighthouse Church/Strategic Planning Team Continues Its Work

Pastor's Report

This report will read much like my report in 2023 because: The Huron UMC congregation continues to grow, mature, and thrive! This is due in large part because of the efforts and dedication of our staff, the congregation's leadership, and the faithfulness of each member and regular attendee! We continue to move forward faithfully, offering our prayers, presence, gifts, service, and witness in service to Jesus! We are also thrilled to be a Lighthouse Church and take great pride in being a welcoming congregation!

We have continued the many mission and ministry efforts with which we are involved, as well as continuing to offer three worship opportunities each weekend: Saturdays @ 5! and Sundays at 8:00 AM and 10:00 AM (including online worship). We have also continued to offer Daily Devotions at 4:30 PM on most weekdays. Additionally, our Strategic Planning Team, which developed as a "next step" to our Lighthouse Church training, continues to learn and plan!

Our numerous mission, ministry, and outreach involvements include (but are not limited to): the collection of items for the Huron Helping Hands Food Pantry and funds for UMCOR, participating in the Huron Community Churches Vacation Bible School, offering the community worship celebration – The S'more the Merrier – the first Saturday in December, hosting a Trunk or Treat event in our parking lot, and holding a Rally Day celebration each year. (And we are currently working on a new event – Oktoberfest Lite!) We also continue to support the mission and ministry of Flat Rock Homes and the Huron Community Prayer Path & Labyrinth.

We continue to welcome folks of all generations for our weekly learning and worship celebrations.

- which includes activities such as a class for adults, United Methodist Youth Group, Confirmation class time, and a class for younger kids. We also have time for all the kids to sing and prepare for Christmas Eve worship.
- Saturdays @ 5! A relaxed, coffee shop type worship celebration.
- Sundays at 8:00 AM (Praise Band) and 10:00 AM (Organ and Choir)

This year we celebrated the 54+ years of mission and ministry of our beloved organist, Norma Cook, who has been named Organist Emeritus. It was a great celebration that featured a community choir and a commissioned anthem based on Norma's favorite hymn. Thankfully, we have been blessed by the talent/skill of our new organist, Tom Curry. Music continues to be a vital part of our ministry at HUMC!

We have continued to celebrate births and baptisms, weddings, and the lives of loved ones who have gone on to the Church Triumphant. We have also continued to confirm and welcome new folks, many who have become members via professions of faith and confirmation. Our Stephen Ministry Team continues to grow and do great work, reaching those who need someone to walk alongside them.

Incredible things are happening at Huron UMC and lives are being changed! I have said it before and I will say it again: As the pastor, I am so proud of the work of our staff, our congregational leadership, and all the members and regular attendees of Huron UMC (WooHoo!). Lay Leader's Report

This past year has seen our weekly attendance increase to over 150—both in person and on line. Our Lighthouse Committee that was launched to help all those who choose to attend has morphed into the Strategic Planning Committee. This committee has been charged with guiding our church into the future by developing new programs (Lift Lite) and by helping our existing programs change and develop as our church grows.

As we continue to grow, it is hoped that as we Welcome ALL to Worship with us that ALL will then join us to go out and Witness!

What Is The First Reading List?

As a result of our 2024 membership audit, we found many people listed on our membership roll with whom we have lost contact or who haven't attended in quite some time. Further research found that quite a few of them had passed away without our knowledge. For the remainder, we searched for current addresses in an attempt to re-establish contact and inquire as to how they wanted to proceed with their membership with HUMC.

We sent out 124 letters to those for whom we had addresses; 14 responded wishing to maintain their membership; 23 asked to be withdrawn. Seven letters were returned by the post office as undeliverable, and 73 did not respond at all (80 total). Those 80, plus those for whom we do not have addresses, are put on the First Reading list. This list was included with our Charge Conference paperwork. These persons are considered for removal from our membership roll. But wait! – they are not removed yet.

We have to go through the whole process again next year to see if any more respond. Those we don't hear from are put on the Second Reading list. After that list is "read" at Charge Conference, then we may remove them from our membership.

To be as thorough as possible, we have posted the First Reading list on the tack strip in Rooms 3 & 4 for all to peruse. If you have contact with anyone on the list or other information, please let Beth Anne know. Correct addresses would be most helpful.

So essentially, anyone listed now has another year to say they wish to remain a member before they are removed by Charge Conference action. And if they are removed, but later decide they want to maintain membership, they may be easily reinstated.

After this whole process is completed, we will have a much better idea of the population of our membership roll and we can get everyone in our Realm database for easier maintenance.

It is suggested that churches do a membership audit every 4 years. Subsequent audits should be much less involved if we get things up to date this time.

Stewardship letters, along with the 2025 Narrative Budget brochure and Estimate of Giving cards, have been mailed to each household. Please take some time to review these materials and prayerfully consider your giving to HUMC for the coming year. (A duplicate card is included in this newsletter on the page 9.) We ask that you return your completed card by Sunday, November 17, 2024.



Your response will help us plan the programs, mission projects, and outreach events for 2025, allowing us to assess funding needs and set goals. Stewardship Moments will also be shared during worship celebrations over the next several weeks.




