From The Desk Of Pastor P.

Back in mid-December, amidst a crazy schedule, incredible busyness, and preparations for weekends in Advent and all our Christmas celebrations, I made the decision to choose a word for 2025 – a word upon which to focus, meditate, and pray. This would be a word to study in-depth, a word that would become an integral part of, and which would guide, my everyday life for the entire year. I decided to spend the first seven days of the new year praying about, looking for, and being open to what my word would be. I made a list and kept track of how many times, over the course of the week, the words on my list appeared or presented themselves to me. Overwhelmingly, the word hope rose to the top of the list. My word for 2025 is HOPE.

My goal for 2025 is to really study the concept of hope and to incorporate what I am learning into the way I live and as I live out my call as a disciple of Jesus Christ. My first steps in researching hope include actually looking up definitions for hope and reading the book HOPE RISING: How The Science Of Hope Can Change Your Life by Casey Gwinn, J.D. and Chan Hellman, Ph.D.

So, as this year-long journey begins, I ask: what is hope? Some definitions follow.


- hope to cherish a desire with anticipation: to want something to happen or be true; to desire with expectation of obtainment or fulfillment; to expect with confidence


From HOPE RISING:



HUMC Team Updates

Trustees

Trustees oversee the use of Memorial Funds. Some memorials have designated uses requested by families such as music ministry, maintenance and project specific requests. Trustees have used unspecified memorial funds to purchase items, such as Christmas decorations, Staff Computers, Audio/Visual equipment and maintenance tools. Trustees are hopeful to move away from designated funds to allow memorial funds to be utilized on an as needed basis.

Did you know the original note taken to fund the roof and boiler project was \$250,000.00? To date, donations and pledges received leave a \$72,000.00 balance to pay the note back in full. Thank you for your support of our church home.

Here are a few items the Trustees have on the long range planning list: repair/renovation of the parking lot, handicap accessible/updated restrooms, Fellowship Hall and Sanctuary lighting evaluation/update.



Church Council


At the December 10th meeting of Church Council, Derek Callin presented a motion from SPRC to increase the salary for the position of organist by \$10,000.

After the proposal was read, Derek explained that this increase would not affect the budget since our apportionments have been reduced and would cover it. Council approved this salary change.



Our Weather Cancellation Policy

In early 2019, Trustees, with input from Pastor Pamela, adopted the following rules for church cancellations due to winter weather. When the Eric County Sheriff's Office calls a:

Level 1 Snow Emergency – Worship and activities will go on as scheduled. Use your discretion for determining your safety.

Level 2 Snow Emergency – Worship will be held for all those who choose to attend if they feel that they can travel safely. Choir Director may cancel Choir at his discretion. All other non-worship church activities are cancelled.

Level 3 Snow Emergency – Worship and all other activities will be cancelled for the day even if the Level 3 is lifted part way through the day.

We want everyone to remain safe and healthy. (If you have any doubt, stay put – the Lord understands!)
