Christ has risen! Christ has risen, indeed! Alleluia!

As we draw close to the conclusion of the Great Fifty Days, I find myself reflecting over and over again on the

great hope God has given us! We celebrate the Ascension on the 31st and 1st (a little late, but I'm guessing very few

folks would come for a midweek celebration) and Pentecost when the Holv Spirit comes! is right around the corner! There is reason to HOPE! God is the ultimate "hope dealer!"

Like many of my friends and colleagues, I have pretty much given up on watching "regular" TV these days and have challenged myself to read more. (I've already surpassed my goal of 20 books for the year!) Of course, several of these books are centered on or around the theme or concept of HOPE! Currently, I am reading a compilation of quotes gathered from the works of theologian and scholar Walter Brueggemann entitled A GOSPEL OF HOPE. Given our current place within the context of the liturgical year and where we are politically and socially, I found the quote that follows both enlightening and HOPE -filled!

There is an Easter revolution coming here whereby the world will be brought to new life. And we are players in that movement. It begins in vivid hope and it ends in wondrous well-being. We get from crying out to well-being by the fidelity of God. At the center of the story are bread and wine, gift, and newness... It is about the God who is more ready to give gifts than we are to receive them. We stand among those who have sought and asked – and received! (p. 100)


There is hope! God offers us hope


us share the Good News of the Risen Savior!" Let us all be HOPE DEALERs!


HUMC Camperships





We celebrated our graduates on Sunday, May 25th during the 10:00 a.m. Worship celebration, followed by a reception.






