From The Desk Of Pastor P.

Merry Christmas! (Yes, I can still say that as we are now in the actual Christmas Season!) And soon we will be celebrating the Epiphany – the coming of the “wise ones” – bearing gifts for the young Messiah and showing that Jesus, the Incarnation – God is with us, came for all people! Now, obviously, not everyone believes this and I would argue that that is “ok;” and that even in our differences, Jesus calls us to love one another!

As I write this article, the Jewish celebration of Hanukkah has just begun and, by the time you read this, it will be over. Hanukkah, very simply put, is the Jewish holiday that celebrates the miracle of one day’s worth of oil lasting for eight, symbolizing hope and faith. It is also called the Festival of Lights.

If you attended worship on Sunday, December 14th, you heard me tell the story of my, before a recent concert, placing a tiny Jesus on the seats of some folks. One of those folks happened to be Jewish. No, she was not offended! She smiled, thanked me, and... still carries Jesus in her performance folder!

Well, she “turned around” and gave me “an early Hanukkah gift.” It was a tiny Nativity set, which I shared with the kids during worship. What a JOY! (Which by the way... is the word for 2026!) And the lesson – we really can love and respect one another even when our faiths are different, when our backgrounds are different, when our beliefs are different... and on and on and on!

This experience reminded me of the chorus to one of my favorite “contemporary: Christmas songs, LET THIS CHRISTMAS BE, with which I close this article. I invite you to hold

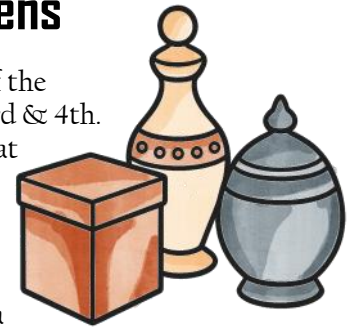


Epiphany/Removal Of The Greens

You are invited to join LIFT (Living In Faith Together). This is our evening of multigenerational fellowship. We have classes, conversation, puzzles, foosball and games. LIFT is set to restart on Wednesday, January 7th.

Children's classes are back with the winter edition of Deep Blue. This awe-inspiring resource incorporates adventure, exciting stories, science experiments, and more into a living-faith experience! Children will



explore families in the Bible, learn how today's faith families care for children as they grow, build loving relationships, and find out what it means to be part of God's family! The Deep Blue curriculum includes: weekly session plans, Bible verses, games, art, science, worship, prayers, activity sheets, posters, and interactive Bible stories. Each week children are encouraged to dig deeper and apply the Bible story and lesson to their daily lives.

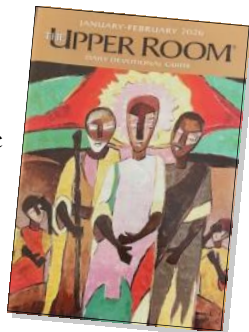
Church Office Holiday Hours

Our Weather Cancellation Policy

In early 2019, Trustees, with input from Pastor Pamela, adopted the following rules for church cancellations due to winter weather. When the Eric County Sheriff's Office calls a:

Level 1 Snow Emergency – Worship and activities will go on as scheduled. Use your discretion for determining your safety.

Level 2 Snow Emergency – Worship will be held for all those who choose to attend if they feel that they can travel safely. Choir Director may cancel Choir at his discretion. All other non-worship church activities are cancelled.

Level 3 Snow Emergency – Worship and all other activities will be cancelled for the day even if the Level 3 is lifted part way through the day.


Furthermore, if Huron City Schools are closed, any activities – studies, classes, etc. – taking place at the church before 10:30/11:00 a.m. are cancelled. This will give our Trustees time to clear and treat walks.

We want everyone to remain safe and healthy. (If you have any doubt, stay put – the Lord understands!)

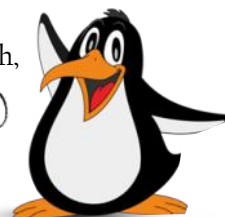
May we hold onto HOPE and be filled with JOY in 2026 as we remember that God claims us and loves us – NO MATTER WHAT!
